**i. Campton Township Highway District Report**

**bi-1 Sink Holes**

- Sink holes were found on Farmview Road; Black Willow and Hemlock.
- At the September 19 Board Meeting, the Board approved a contract with Active Excavating & Wrecking to make the needed repairs.
- Fox Mill Blvd has a sink hole in the road currently, and the Township will request the Village to share the cost of repairs 50/50.
- 3A sink hole was repaired by the Campton Township Highway District on James Fenimore Cooper.

**bi-2 Tree Trimming Along McDonald Road**

- McDonald Road is in need of tree trimming. Ron Searl reported that the village is currently getting bids from tree services. Once all bids received, they will go to the Board for approval on October 17 with trimming to begin after December 1.
- The trees on McDonald road that hinder a clear line of vision will be charged to MFT. The remaining will be charged to the Road and Bridge Fund for Plato Township. The Village has requested the Township Highway District to provide a list of roads with trees that need, or will need, trimming over the next year.
- Scott Eveland reported that the Township Highway department does some limited trimming but the department lacks a bucket truck for doing major trimming.

**bi-3 FY 2017 - 2018 Street Program Proposal**

Scott Eveland advised to save money and thus repair more roads, the Township Highway department is proposing to use a treatment of stone and oil. Scott noted that using this treatment on Swanberg Rd. cost approximately \$64,000. In contrast, he said that an asphalt overlay would have cost \$2.5M.
