8. **Discussion of Update of Comprehensive Plan** The commission discussed the direction they should take in reviewing the comprehensive plan. The comprehensive plan should be tailored to the village's vision and mission. It should need very little refining. Ask yourself if the fundamental things are included. One issue to discuss is the plan to have a Town Center on Rt 64 and LaFox Road. A development like that would require a central sewer and water system and the Wasco District is a maximum capacity. There is also a plan for commercial on Route 47 that should be reviewed to determine if it is in keeping with the village's vision and mission.
