

**VILLAGE CODE AMENDMENT
VILLAGE OF CAMPTON HILLS
AMENDMENT TO SECTION 1-4-4 OF THE VILLAGE CODE
AND REPEALING TITLE 12 OF THE VILLAGE CODE**

BE IT ORDAINED BY THE PRESIDENT AND BOARD OF TRUSTEES OF THE VILLAGE OF CAMPTON HILLS, KANE COUNTY, ILLINOIS AS FOLLOWS:

SECTION 1: Title 12 of the Village Code is hereby repealed.

SECTION 2: Section 1-4-4 of the Village Code is hereby amended to provide as follows:

1-4-4 PAYMENT FOR MINOR OFFENSES:

- A. P Ticket Instead Of Complaint Authorized: Whenever a police officer is authorized to arrest a person without a warrant because of a violation of an ordinance or this Code, he may, in lieu of filing a complaint in court, in the first instance, issue to the violator a "P Ticket" called an "Ordinance Violation".
- B. Contents Of P Tickets: P Tickets issued pursuant to subsection A of this Section shall contain language:
1. Advising said person that said person has violated a specified section of this Code or specified ordinance;
 2. Requesting said person to make payment in an amount applicable to said alleged violation as set forth in subsection E of this Section as settlement of said violation claim; and
 3. Informing said person that upon failure to so settle, a complaint will be filed in the Circuit Court of the 18th Judicial Circuit, or in Administrative Adjudication, charging said person with such violation and such P Ticket constitutes a notice to appear to answer such complaint.
- C. Payment In Lieu Of Fine Authorized:
1. Pursuant to a P Ticket issued as set forth in this Section, the person so accused of said violation may settle and compromise the violation claim by paying to the Village the applicable amount as shown in the schedule set forth in subsection E of this Section, within a period to be specified in said

citation but not more than fourteen (14) days from the time said alleged offense was committed.

2. Such payment shall be made in accordance with the instructions contained in the P Ticket at the Village office and a receipt shall be issued for the money so received. Such payment shall promptly be remitted to the Village Treasurer.

D. Procedure Upon Nonpayment: In the event that the person to whom a P Ticket is issued pursuant to this Section fails to settle and pay said violation claim within the prescribed time, or within a period of time specified in a final notice, then the Village or the Village Police Department is authorized to file a complaint and to prosecute the same in the 18th Judicial Circuit Court.

E. Amounts Of Payments:

1. The violation claim described in a P Ticket issued pursuant to the terms of this Section may be settled, compromised and paid in the respective amounts set forth in the following schedule:

- a. In the event that said payment is made within fourteen (14) days after the delivery of the P Ticket, the following amounts shall be accepted as settlement:

Any violation of this Code relative to	
parking of a vehicle	\$ 25.00
Underage possession or consumption of alcohol or possession of drug paraphernalia or possession of cannabis, under 10 grams	\$250.00
Curfew Violation	\$100.00
Any violation of this Code relative to the	
regulating of dogs and cats or the licensing of dogs	
First offense	25.00
Each successive offense	50.00
Any violation of this Code relative to the	
regulating and licensing of businesses	100.00

- b. In the event that payment has not been made within fourteen (14) days after delivery of the P Ticket, and a final notice has been delivered, the following amounts shall be accepted as settlement:

Any violation of this Code relative to the	
parking of a vehicle	\$ 50.00
Any violation of this Code relative to the	
regulating of dogs and cats or the licensing of dogs	
First offense	50.00
Each successive offense	100.00
Any violation of this Code relative to the	
regulating and licensing of businesses	200.00
Any other offense - - amount payable within fourteen days is doubled	

2. In the event that payment is not made within the time prescribed in the final notice, and a complaint is filed in the circuit court, or in Administrative Adjudication, payment of any fine and costs shall be in such amounts as may be determined and established by the circuit court or the Administrative Adjudication Hearing Officer .)

F. Method of Delivery: Any P Ticket, notice or complaint referred to in this Section 1-4-4 may be delivery by personal service or mailed by first class mail addressed to the last known address of the person named in the document being served; if mailed, the document is presumed to have been delivered on the third day after mailing.

G. Presumption Of Traffic Violation: The fact that an automobile or motor vehicle which is illegally operated or parked is then currently registered with the Secretary of State of the State of Illinois in the name of a person, shall be considered prima facie proof that said person was in control of, or had authorized the use of, or was the operator of the automobile or motor vehicle at the time of such alleged violation.

SECTION 3: Any motion, order, resolution or ordinance in conflict with the provisions of this Ordinance is, to the extent of such conflict, hereby superseded and waived.

SECTION 4. This Ordinance shall take full force and effect upon its passage, approval and publication as provided by law. This Ordinance shall be published in pamphlet form.
