

VILLAGE OF CAMPTON HILLS
2014 PREVAILING WAGE ADOPTION

WHEREAS, the State of Illinois has enacted "An Act regulating wages of laborers, mechanics and other workers employed in any public works by the State, county, city or any public body or any political subdivision or by any one under contract for public works", approved June 26, 1941, as amended, being 820 ILCS 130/0.01 through 130/12 (the Prevailing Wage Act) and

WHEREAS, the aforesaid Act provides that the Board of Trustees of the Village of Campton Hills shall periodically investigate and ascertain the prevailing rate of wages as defined in said Act for laborers, mechanics and other workers in the locality of said Village who are working on "public works" as defined in said Act.

NOW THEREFORE, Be It Ordained by the President and Board of Trustees of the Village of Campton Hills, Kane County, Illinois that:

SECTION 1: To the extent and as required by the Prevailing Wage Act, the general prevailing rate of wages in this locality for laborers, mechanics and other workers engaged in construction of public works coming under the jurisdiction of the Village of Campton Hills lying within Kane County, is hereby ascertained to be the same as the prevailing rate of wages for construction work in the Kane County area as determined by the Department of Labor of the State of Illinois as of June 2014, a copy of that determination being attached hereto and incorporated herein by reference. The definition of any terms appearing in this Ordinance which are also used in aforesaid Act shall be the same as in said Act.

SECTION 2: Nothing herein contained shall be construed to apply said general prevailing rate of wages as herein ascertained to any work or employment except public works construction of the Village of Campton Hills to the extent required by the aforesaid Act.

SECTION 3: The Village Clerk shall publicly post or keep available for inspection by any interested party in the main office of this Village this determination of such prevailing rate of wage.

SECTION 4: The Village Clerk shall mail a copy of this determination to any employer, and to any association of employers and to any person or association of employees who have filed, or file their names and addresses, requesting copies of any determination stating the particular rates and the particular class of workers whose wages will be affected by such rates.

SECTION 5: The Village Clerk shall cause to be published in a newspaper of general circulation within the area a notice of adoption of this Ordinance, and such publication shall constitute notice that the determination is effective and that this is the determination of this public body.


SECTION 6: The Village Clerk shall promptly file a certified copy of this Ordinance with the Secretary of State of the State of Illinois.

SECTION 7. This Ordinance shall be in full force and effect from and after the date of its passage, approval and publication as required by law. This Ordinance shall be published in pamphlet form.
